
Black Jack





Rules and game play

You decide how to play! Take further cards or bet on the dealer (bank) going bust? You can pick your own strategy!

The aim with Black Jack is to get a hand with a value as close as possible to 21 without exceeding this total. Although you may be sitting at a table with several people, each person is playing alone against the dealer. The cards 2-10 are counted at their nominal value. The face cards Jack, Queen and King are each worth 10. The Ace is either worth one or eleven whatever is most advantageous for you.



Black Jack

You win! Should your first two cards be an Ace and a card worth ten, then you have the best card combination, which also takes its name from the game: a Black Jack! You will immediately receive a payout worth 1.5 times your bet provided the dealer does not also have a Black Jack.

If your hand is closer to 21 than the dealer's at the end of the round, you will receive winnings worth the value of your stake (1:1). When a tie or push takes place, no winnings are paid out.



Bust

If you bet on the dealer going bust, in other words that the value of their cards exceeds 21, you will receive a payout of 2.5:1 in the event of a win. To do so place your wager on the field "Bust".

Perfect Pairs

With Perfect Pairs, you can bet that your first two cards form a pair. If this pair consists of two identical cards, your stake will be paid out at 25:1.

If the first two cards are a pair of the same colour, your winnings will be paid out 12:1 while a pair in different colours pay 6:1.

Game play

At the beginning of each round, place your bet in the designated area. Once all bets have been placed, the game can begin!

You, each of the other players and the dealer all receive one card. A second card is then only dealt to you and the other players. Only when all players have decided whether or not to take an additional card does the dealer draw one or more cards for the bank.

The dealer must always abide by the following rules:

- If the dealer has 16 points or less, they must draw another card.
- Should the dealer go bust, by exceeding a total of 21 points, all players still participating in the game win.
- If the dealer has a hand worth 17 or more, they must stand and may not take any further cards.

Your options - Your decision!

- Take another card ("hit" or "card"),
- Refuse another card ("stand" or "no more"),
- You can split two cards of the same value.

Example: You draw two eights, which have a combined value of 16, and split them into two separate hands each worth eight. You are now playing two hands and place

an extra bet. Both hands are played independently. If you should draw another eight for the first hand, you may split again and now play three hands. The number of splits is not limited. When splitting aces, you only receive one further card per ace. Should this card have a value of ten, you hand will be worth 21 but will not be a Black Jack. The same applies when you split cards worth ten and receive an ace as the next card.

- Double down: Here you double your stake and then only receive one additional card, without the possibility of drawing another.
- ◆ Insurance: If the bank's first card is revealed as an ace, you have the option of insuring your wager against the dealer having Black Jack. If you opt to take insurance, you set half of your original bet on the Insurance line. If the dealer draws a Black Jack, the insurance wager is paid out 2:1. If you are aiming for Black Jack yourself, you can opt for "Even Money", and look forward to a 1:1 payout whatever the outcome.
